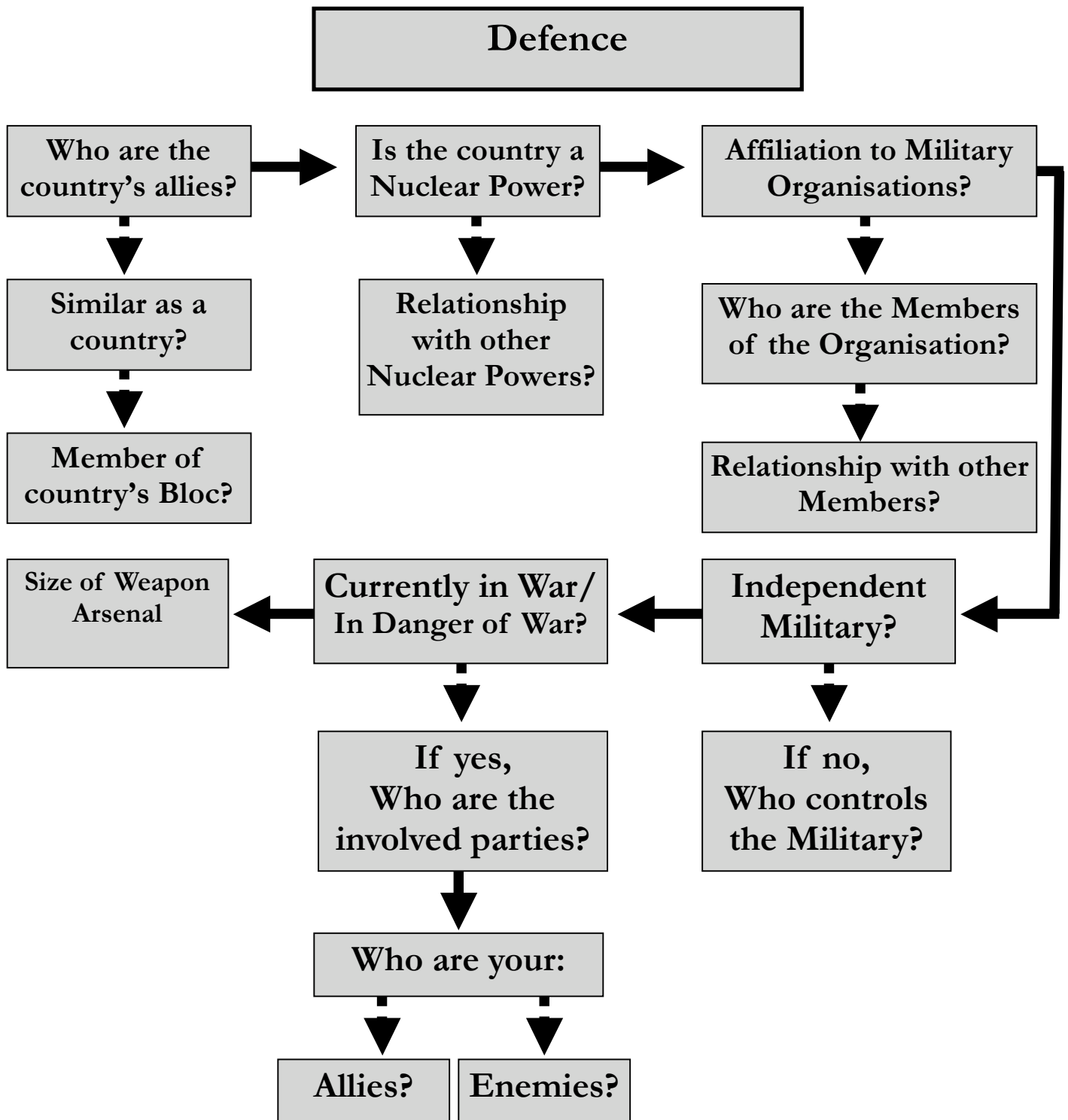


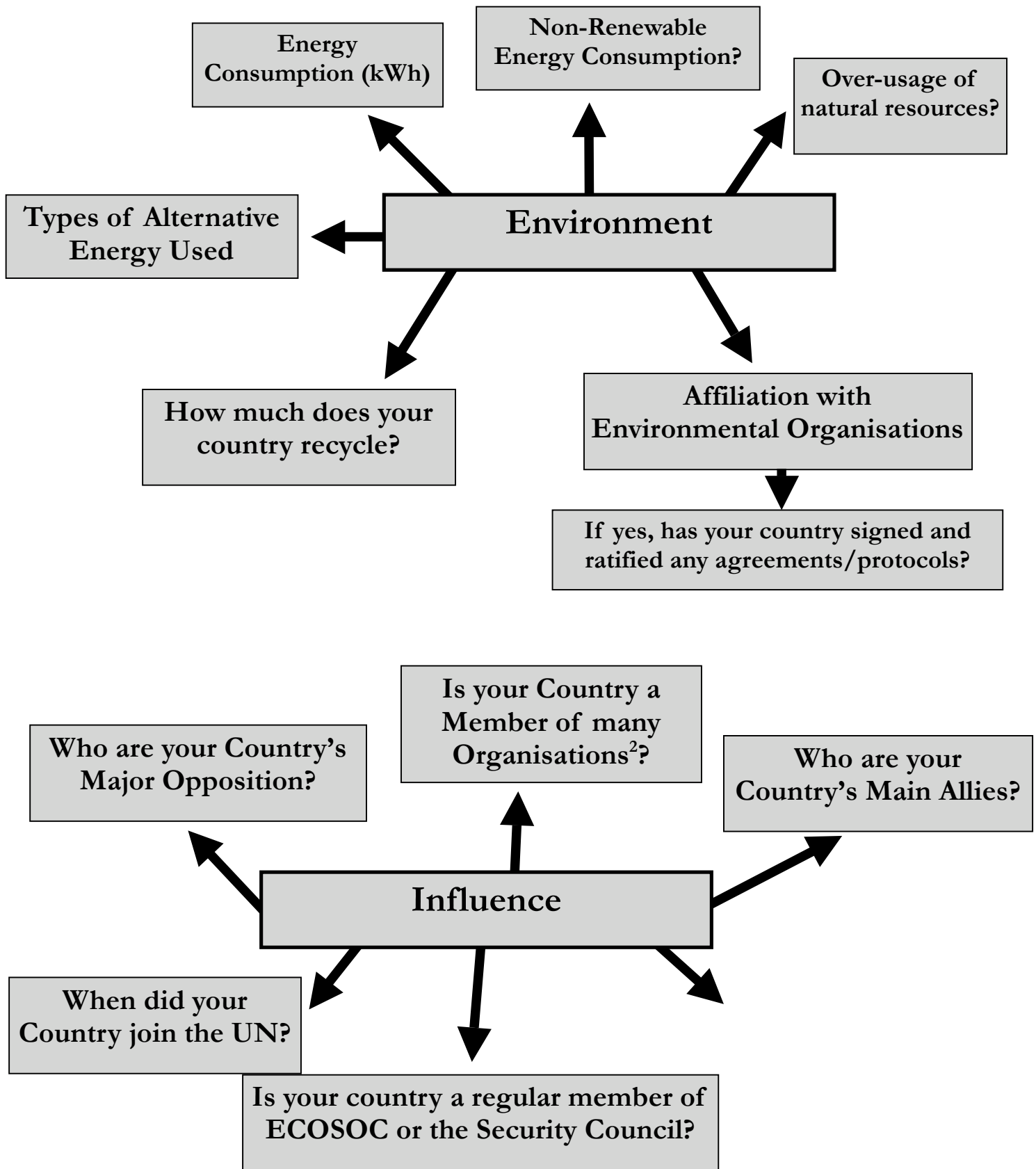
Foot Notes:

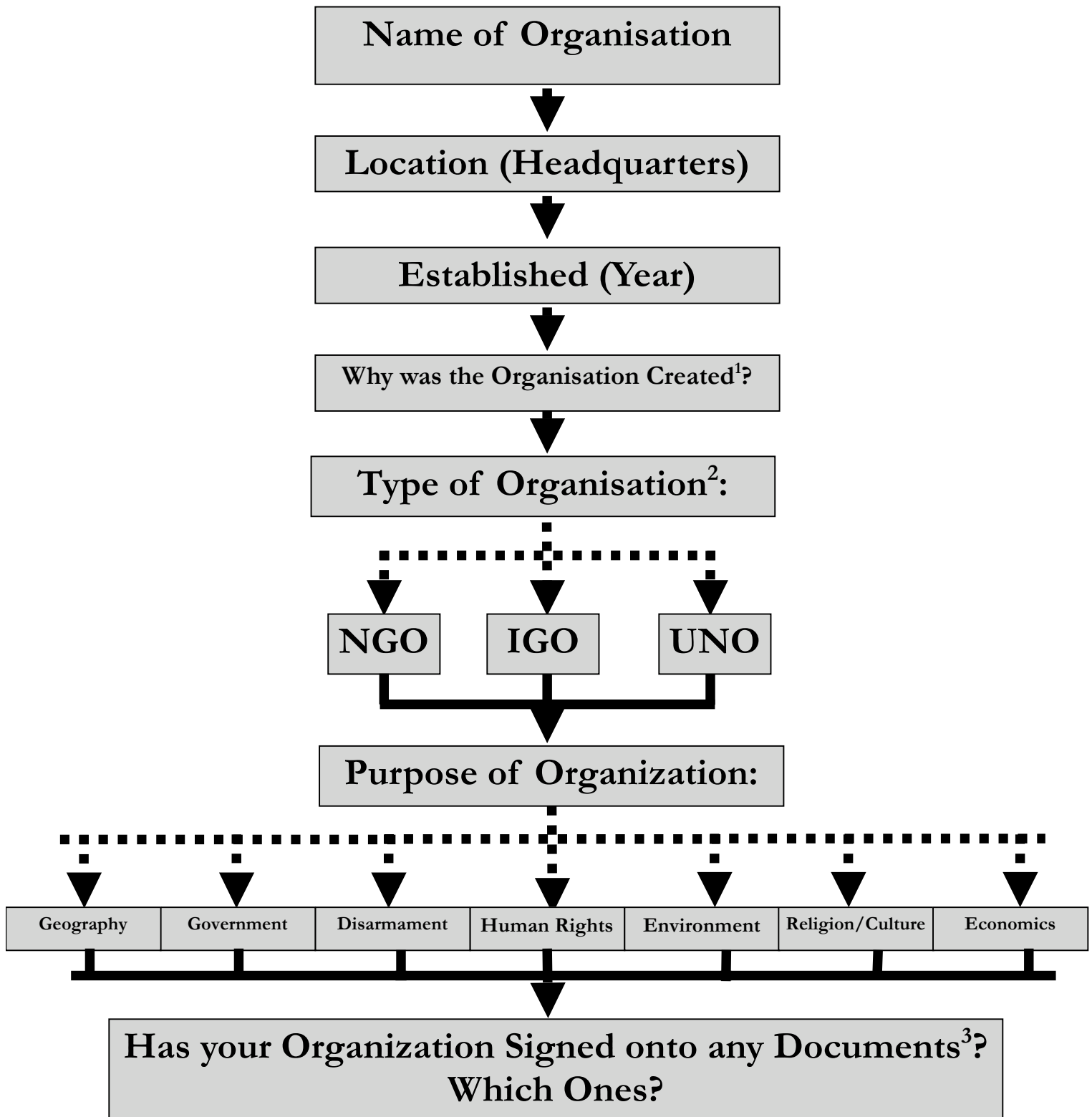
Foot Notes:

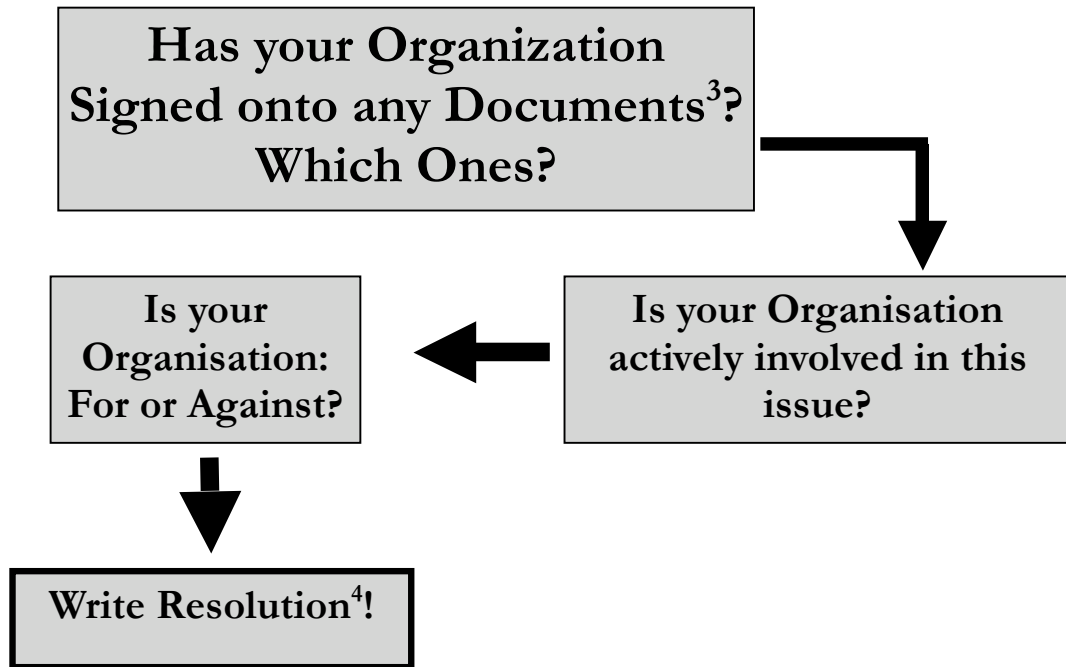

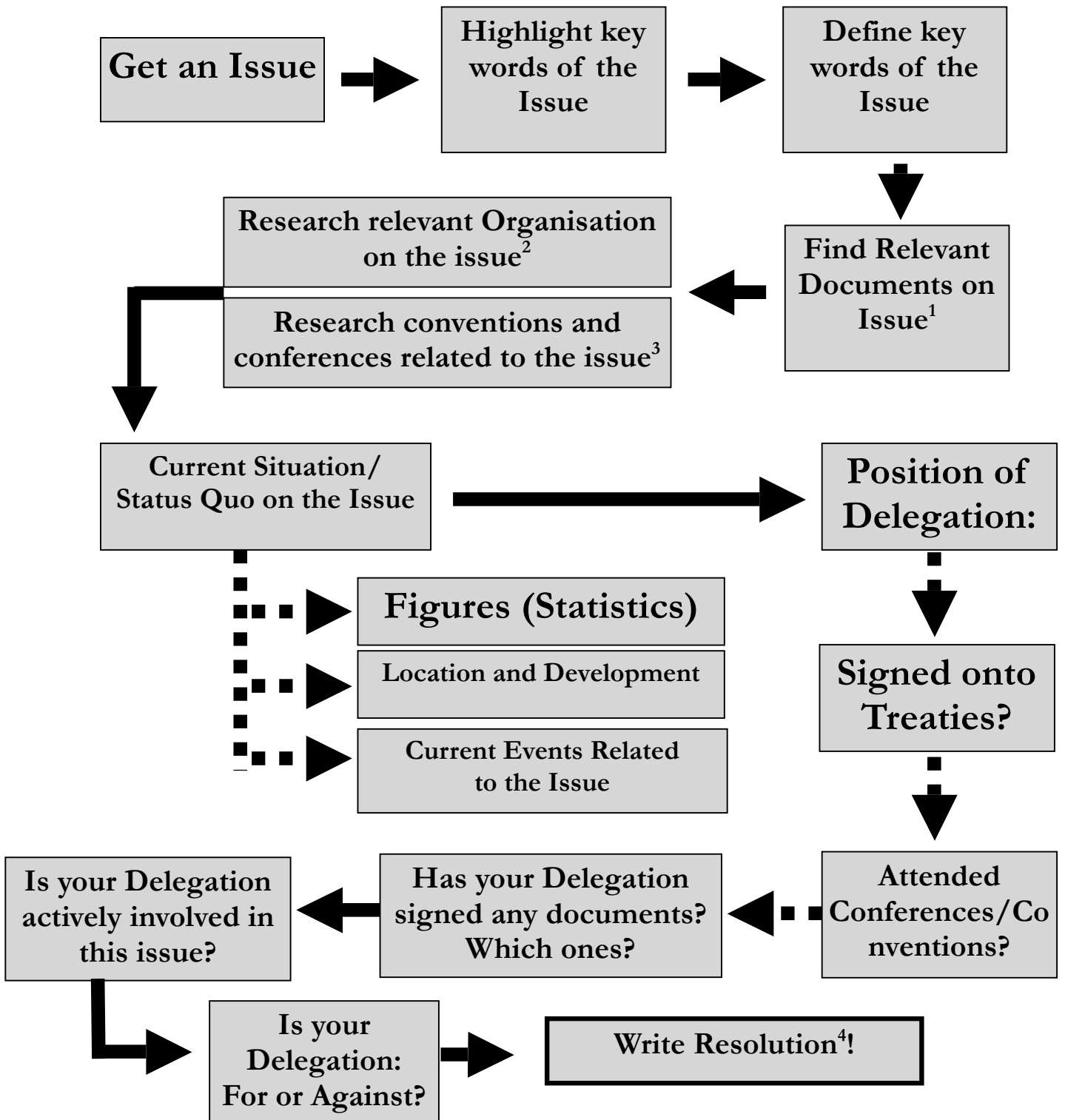
