PLACING OF SYMBOLS

Celebrant: As the symbols of the life of Jane are brought forward, we pray with gratitude that she now shares with Christ the fulness of life.

Commentator Introduces Each Symbol:

Flowers: Jane had an eye for the beauty of flowers and admired the master gardener that is our God. She had many favourites from Sturt Desert Pea to Peonies and all in between. Many a trip to Perth resulted in bringing back to Hedland seedlings.

Constitutions & Statutes: These books of the Daughters of Charity are an enduring symbol of Jane's commitment and faith-filled life. The words were translated into action as Jane committed herself to mutuality of

service.

Dockers Scarf: This scarf symbolises Jane's love for the under-dog, the people forgotten and marginalised in our society.

Family Photos: Jane gave extraordinary time and effort to keep a strong connection to her family.

Red Soil: An urban myth in the Pilbara is that once it gets into your blood then it stays for life, and if you leave, your heart will remain forever.

Rosary Beads: A symbol of Mary's YES which Jane echoed each year on the 25th of March. Mary's faithfulness to the call of God reflected Jane's desire to be faithful to her baptismal promises.

Prayer Book: Jane's well-worn prayer book represents the life of prayer that was so central to Jane's life. She practiced a spirituality of deep listening to the needs of others.
