

The Sketchbook

Hand drawing plays an integral part in our design process. It captures the genesis and energy of the concept - a simple stroke of the pencil capturing the movement of the roofline or the flow of water through a masterplan.

A Baca Architects we often draw on detail paper with 0.7 or 0.9 retractable pencils. Detail paper has semi-coarse grain that captures the graphite of the pencil enabling lighter or heavier line weights. The semi-transparent nature of detail piper also enables the author to overlay drawings to refine shapes, patterns, and ideas. A Baca drawing is quite characteristic using colour shading added from the reverse of the paper – and like many of the drawings here with this collection of sketches often the drawing is transferred onto watercolour paper and flooded with colour via brush.

Whilst computer software packages have become increasingly more sophisticated - there is nothing more satisfying than sitting alongside your client capturing their ideas in real time whilst they describe their vision for their site. It has an immediacy, captures the spoken word in three dimensions and more than often is the constant reference point for the projects intent as it moves from concept, to building permits, construction drawings, to site then habitation.

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


Ashwicken Lake Water Lily PADS

The Water Lily is both architecture and a living sculpture - a floating island consisting of 40-flatted units located in the southeast corner of Ashwicken Lake.

The resort centred on waterside living, water-based recreation and wellness is set to offer a memorable yet, tranquil staycation. Inspired by the water lily or lotus plant whose big leaves float on the water's surface to attract ample sunlight for photosynthesis, Baca adopts this shape to evoke serenity amongst its visitors and synthesise human wellbeing.

Australian Underwater Discovery Centre

A radical under water marine observatory 2 km out at sea at the end of Busselton Jetty in Geographe Bay, Western Australia.


Above the water, the design is an abstract interpretation of a whale raising it's head over Geographe Bay. This was inspired by the whale manoeuvre, the "Spy Hop". Underneath the water, the AUDC will become the world's largest natural marine observatory. The massive underwater observatory allows the public to view, dine and sleep on the oceans floor at 8m below the water's surface.





Summary:

Baca Architects have designed a sustainable eco resort for Bíku in Bocas del Toro, Panama. The business will reinvest profits into the community. The site is only accessible by boat. Visitors will be welcomed at the water's edge by the main lodge. Whilst the cutting patterns are designed in London, the lodge and trees are constructed from materials sourced on site and with local labour.

Tourism Activation Centre

Project Goal:

A bold sightseeing tower rises from the horizon line which is formed by a park's palm trees signalling the position of the Tourism Activation Centre at the Red Sea coast.


Summary:

As visitors weave through the park, the centre begins to reveal itself. Through its landscape design, sculptural seating and architecture, visitors are lead to the tower and the nearby building entrance. The sightseeing tower, 40m in height, features a lift and spiral staircase that elevates visitors to viewing platforms which afford panoramic views over the site and out to the Red Sea beyond. Visitors can then enter the main buildings, containing the Visitor Centre, Exhibition Spaces, Marina Area and Dive Centre.

Summary:

The ambition is not to replicate a European hotel design but to develop an architecture borne out of a western African vernacular.


Summary:





Project Goal: As resistant to flooding as it is luxurious. Located in an idilic setting on the River Thames, the house has been inundated with water on numerous occasions. The new CLIENT: 380m2 replacement dwelling delivers 7 bedrooms, generous open AWN Enterprise space living areas and additional play & relaxation spaces. The latter are located on the flood resistant ground floor, which prevents water from entering. 
Royal Reach Marina


Project Goal:


Set on the River Thames, Royal Reach Marina will deliver an iconic landmark for West London. The marina's function and amenity is preserved, upgraded and enhanced.


Summary:

A new 5 star, 300 bedroom hotel will be a sustainable landmark development, including low energy consumption through design, reducing demand on grid utilities. The proposals will expand and enhance the marina but upgrading the existing marina facilities and introducing Water Villas along the River Thames. A floating restaurant (with a conservatory on the roof) accessible to the public provided at the riverbank and a new footbridge will provide a much-needed connection at this stretch of the river.
