

## Does seller have to fix radon?

EPA RECOMMENDS: If you are buying or selling a home, have it tested for radon. For a new home, ask if radon-resistant construction features were used and if the home has been tested. Fix the home if the radon level is 4 picocuries per liter (pCi/L) or higher.

Long term examinations require a device that remains in the house for longer than 90 days each time. Radon service providers can do both kinds of examinations in your home, yet more than likely will run numerous short term tests to gather a reading. ## How do you get rid of radon in your home?

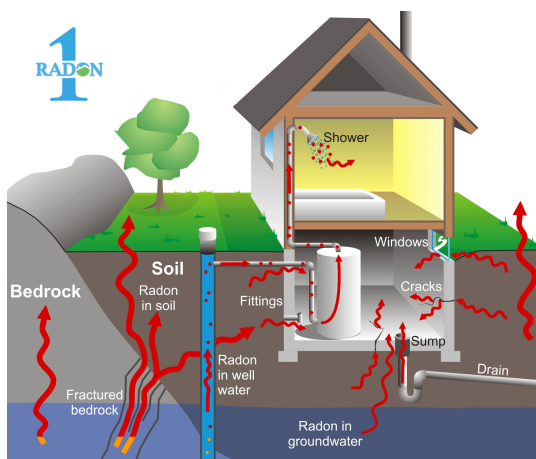

Common techniques include: Sub-slab depressurization, where suction pipes are inserted through the floor or concrete slab into the concrete slab below the home. A radon vent fan then draws out the radon gas and releases it into the air outside.

That means that even if your home's radon was below the EPA's suggested action level of 4.0 picocuries per liter of air during the warmer months, it could be above that level during the winter.

Radon degrees inside a home often tend to rise several hours after reduced barometric stress and also high winds occur outside, so it's not really a good idea to run a radon test right after a tornado. Your radon levels will climb and also appear to be abnormally greater than normal. ## Is there a blood test for radon?

It is recommended that you test the Radon levels in your home at least twice a year, similar to annual medical or dental check-ups. In the event that the levels are found to be high, it warrants at least one or two more tests so that the results can be compared.
