### ROSS COUNTY 2 INVERNESS CT 2



An Aaron Doran corker and a great back post finish from Brad Mckay seemed to be enough to win the Highland Derby in the fifth round of the Scottish Cup, but Josh Mullins equalised in injury time.

The game finished 2-2 at Victoria Park. Doran struck first with an dazzling strike. Carl Tremarco cushioned a cross down on the left hand side to Doran in space. He took a touch to put it onto his right and with a slight bounce, the Irishman smacked it from around 25 yards into the bottom corner. F

Subsitue Ross Stewart equalised just after the break as he turned in Michael Gardyne's cross.

Liam Polworth had a go from long range as his drive with little backlift deflected over for a corner and Caley's number seven took the set-piece. Through a scrum of players, it landed fortuitously to Brad Mckay near the backpost, who took his time to thump it home with his shooting boots to get the Caley Jags ahead again.

But two substitutes managed to break the backline in heartbreaking fashion. Declan McManus touched a ball around Brad McKay and with only the goalkeeper to beat, he hit it straight at Mark Ridgers to save. The next effort was more fortunate for the hosts.

Josh Mullins was barely on the pitch when he received the ball behind the backline and after getting the ball under control on the right hand side, he slipped it under Ridgers at the near post to earn tonight's replay.

# ROSS COUNTY THE OPPONENT

Ross County head to the Tulloch Caledonian Stadium after booking their place in the Irn-Bru Cup Final on Friday night with a 2-1 win over East Fife at the Global Energy Stadium.

Co-Managers' Stuart Kettlewell and Stevie Ferguson have enjoyed a successful first full season as County managers with the Dingwall side currently top of the Ladbrokes Championship and with a game in hand over nearest sides Ayr United and Dundee United.

Tonight's game is the fifth between the sides already this season, County have the slight upper hand as they have won once but the other three games have been tight draws.

County added to their squad in the January transfer window with Daniel Armstrong, Lewis Spence, Kenny van der Weg and Callum Semple coming in to improve the squad.

Joe Thomson's strike just after the re-start was enough for Dunfermline to take all three points against the Caley Jags in a disappointing afternoon at East End Park.

Liam Polworth missed the match with a minor knee injury while Coll Donaldson and Sean Welsh were only fit enough for the bench.

Dunfermline thought they should've had a penalty after 23 minutes as Jamie McCart collided with Bruce Anderson in the box but the referee waved claims away.

Darren McCauley was shortly later booked for a shirt tug on Aidan Connolly and was given a warning by the referee less than ten minutes later after he fouled again. John Robertson responded by bringing on Anthony McDonald for McCauley after 33 minutes.

Shortly after the re-start, Thomson opened the scoring for the Pars as his shot from around 25 yards couldn't be kept out by Mark Ridgers.

The Pars almost had their second on the 60 minute mark as Aidan Connolly saw his volley crash off the crossbar after he was teed up by Blair.

Nathan Austin was introduced for the Caley Jags and he linked up with Jordan White but the strikers effort from just outside the box was wide.

Joe Chalmers then forced Scully into a save with a free-kick from about 20 yards.

Brad Mckay had a last gasp chance for Caley Thistle as Walsh's cross found White, who saw his shot blocked into the path of Mckay but his effort was over the bar.

Caley Thistle remain in the play-off spots despite the disappointing result.

### ICTFC CODE OF CONDUCT

Inverness Caledonian Thistle FC will not tolerate unacceptable conduct at the Tullloch Caledonian Stadium or any away football stadia.

Unacceptable conduct is conduct which is deemed violent or disorderly.

Violent conduct is any actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person, or intentional damage to property.

**Disorderly conduct includes:** 

Conduct which stirs up or sustains or is likely to or is designed to stir up or sustain hatred or ill will towards people or groups of people based on their membership of the following categories:

- Gender, Race, Nationality (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.
- Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.
- Sexual orientation
- Transgender Identity
- Disability
- Or against an individual who is perceived to be a part of such group
- Using threatening, abusive or insulting words or conduct
- Displaying or writing anything which is abusive or insulting
- Using words or conduct or displaying any writing or other thing which indicated the support or affiliation to, or the celebrating of, or opposition to an organisation or group proscribed in the terms of the terrorism act of 2000

All persons entering the Tulloch Caledonian Stadium on a matchday are subject to these rules, including employees and volunteers of ICTFC whilst discharging their duties.

Any person who engages in unacceptable conduct will be liable for sanctions imposed by the club, which may involve possible criminal proceedings, ejection from the stadium, withdrawal of a season ticket and/or exclusion from future matches at the club.
