DeLange #296</u>, known by me to be a credible person who after being duly sworn, upon oath deposes and says that he has good reason to believe and does believe that (name of defendant) <u>James Keylan Willis</u>, heretofore on or about the <u>23rd</u> day of <u>December</u>, A.D. <u>2022</u>, in the State of Texas and County of McLennan, did then and there intentionally or knowingly cause the death of (name of decedent) <u>Stanley Wilcox</u>. Affiant bases his belief up on the following facts:

On 12/29/2022 a report for a missing person was received by the Waco Police Department. On 12/30/2022, affiant was assigned to investigate and follow up on the missing person case of Stanley Wilcox DOB 05/02/1963 from 802 Garrett Ave in Waco Texas. On 12/30/2022, affiant obtained a cell phone that belonged to Stanley Wilcox that was turned in by a homeless female to a local convenience store that the affiant traveled to and collected. Affiant was also able to confirm that a gym he regularly worked out at reported that Stanley had not been to the gym in over ten (10) days which was highly uncharacteristic even despite the Christmas holiday. Affiant traveled to 802 Garrett Ave on 12/30/2022 and contacted three parties who were living in the house that Stanley Wilcox was the legal owner of. These individuals identified themselves to me as: James Keylan Willis DOB 01/08/2004, DOB 05/07/2004, and Brandon Xavier Stephens DOB 11/05/2003. James provided information that Stanley had left the home at 802 Garrett Ave on or near 12/24/2022 after leaving his car keys with James. James gave consent to enter the residence to the affiant who went inside and observed several suspicious circumstances such as: Stanley's bedroom bed was stripped of the bed sheets, there was glass near the threshold of the door, Stanley's identification and debit card were in the living room in odd locations, and many other issues that required explanations. In front of the home was the interior of a car spare tire that was just left next to the front porch, and when asked about this item James claimed to have emptied out the back of a white 2021 Ford Escape with North Carolina plates parked in the driveway to make room for camping equipment. James noted that when he was loading the vehicle to go camping that the vehicle was pulled around the back of the home where it got stuck in the mud. James and the affiant went to the back porch where the affiant observed several other items of interest that were collected as potential evidence. These items included: tools, knife, personal papers belonging to Stanley, packaging tools, and cleaning products. The vehicle was subsequently held, and a search warrant was written.

Upon searching the vehicle there was indication of a large amount of blood that was cleaned up in the trunk area of the car. After confirming this, there was a search warrant written for the home due to the strong belief that the

crime occurred inside the home and a body was transferred into the back of the car. A search warrant was executed on 01/06/2023, and all three parties were inside the home at the time of the search warrant service. All three individuals agreed to consensually interview with detectives, and while interviewing, James Keylan Willis and Brandon Xavier Stephens admitted to being present for and taking active roles in the shooting death of Stanley Wilcox. Both Brandon and James admitted to also cleaning the crime scenes and disposing of Stanley's body in a location that was pointed out in the interview. Detectives along with Crime Scene went to the location pointed out in the interview and recovered a body that bore the same wounds consistent with the criminal offense described by Brandon and James and was wrapped in the bedding that was described by James. Pending autopsy results, there are strong reasons to believe that the body recovered was that of Stanley Wilcox the reported missing person from 12/29/2022.

Specific criminal details of the death of Stanley being verified against the body recovered gives unique knowledge that only the murderer or associate of the murderer would know, and therefore the confessions were believed to be valid. Brandon and James confirmed that a confrontation with Stanley ensued that led to a gunshot being discharged that injured the victim and was confirmed through separate stories. It was reported near the end of the confrontation while Stanley was wounded that they should, "put him out of his misery," showing mental processing of the aggressive act of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon and the clear conscious decision to knowingly cause the death of another person, namely Stanley Wilcox.
