FAO WEBINAR "Breaking Barriers: Gender Equality, Water and Financial Inclusion in Agrifood Systems in Asia and the Pacific" (International Rural Women's Day event)

Background

The FAO report "The Status of Women in Agrifood Systems", published in 2023, underscores the urgent need to empower women as a pivotal step towards sustainable development, calling for immediate action against gender inequalities. Recognizing the vital role of rural women in food and agriculture, the proposed event aligns with the International Rural Women's Day (IRWD) theme, "Financing for Rural Women's Empowerment", as well as with the 2023 World Food Day theme, "Water is life, water is food. Leave no one behind". It emphasizes the nexus between gender equality, water and financial inclusion, aiming to foster change and collaboration for equitable and sustainable agrifood systems.

In the Asia and the Pacific region, women play vital roles across food systems, encompassing agriculture, forestry, fisheries and aquaculture, and livestock. However, their contributions are often overlooked. The FAO report exposes persistent gender-based inequalities within these systems across various dimensions, including water and financial inclusion.

Evidence shows that rural women bear a heavier unpaid workload, including water collection duties. Globally, 80% of those lacking clean drinking water live in rural areas, with women and girls primarily responsible for collecting water, often over long distances. This disproportionately affects young girls, hindering their education and well-being. Furthermore, the report links gender-based violence to water insecurity, noting that violence against women is often rooted in gender norms, which also assign water-related household tasks exclusively to women.

Moreover, multiple barriers impede women's access to financial products and services, including limited resources and discriminatory policies. As highlighted in the report, financial inclusion is a potent tool for empowering rural women and communities. Access to financial services like savings, credit, insurance, and digital payments can substantially enhance economic opportunities, income, asset accumulation, and overall resilience, particularly in the face of water scarcity and climate change. Furthermore, digitization can provide opportunities for enhancing financial inclusion, providing women with financial independence and privacy.

This event seeks to contribute to the implementation of the Regional Gender Strategy and Action Plan 2022-2025 for Asia and the Pacific. The Regional Gender Strategy and Action Plan emphasizes the need for FAO and its Member Nations in the region to prioritize gender equality as a fundamental element in sustaining future food systems. The webinar serves as a platform for learning and reflection, addressing challenges and opportunities in the quest for gender equality. The event will showcase experiences from the Asia-Pacific region, based on insights gathered from FAO country offices and regional development partners. By doing so, it fosters collaborative efforts to establish equitable, efficient, inclusive, and sustainable agri-food systems, aligning with the regional strategy's goals.
