Introduction: Mass shootings, human tragedies, future dangers, sin, lawlessness, and death = The triangle of Evil

Apostle's dual conclusion:

- 1. The Triangle of evil affects everything; but...
- 2. Nothing can separate Christ from His Loved Ones

Key question: Will a bad background separate me from Christs heart?

Key thought: Christ's Grace is greater than your background

I. The Triangle of evil (v12-13) (v12-13)

You are not alone. Sin, lawlessness, and death affect "the world."

- A. Why am I as I am?
 - 1. Sin entered the world through Adam (v12a) (v12a)
 - Sin's consequences spread through the world (v12b+c)
 (v12b+c)
 - a. By repetition (12b) everyone sins (12b)
 - b. By representation (v13-14) original sin touching everyone (v13-14)
 - B. How does humanity React to "original sin"

Complaining: That's not fair

II. The Gospel's response to the triangle of evil

Answering our complaint with these reminders

- A. Even if you don't like the root, you can't deny the fruit (12c- all sinned) (12c-)
 - 1. Original sin keeps us from running away from Jesus (12c)

(12c)

- Original sin keeps us running to Jesus to Jesus (v15)
 (v15)
- B. Even if you don't like the original, you should love the sequel
 - 1. Adam is a "type" of Christ (v14c) (v14c)
 - 2. Christ is an antidote for Adam's sin (v16) (v16)
 - 3. Christ is an antidote for Adam's influence (v17) (v17)

Conclusion: Balancing the scales with Greater Grace
