<p>Computational linguistics is the branch to help in analyzing corpus based studies. It is based on the use of the computer in text analysis. It helps researchers “to extract automatically from a given text any linguistic evidence for his/her hypotheses in order to legitimise the conclusions that can be built upon such hypotheses” (Triki & Sellami-Baklouti, 2002, p. 10). One of the computational tools that can be used for text analysis is the UAM CorpusTool. I am going to animate a workshop on using this tool in the linguistic analysis of texts from various languages (English, French, Arabic, Spanish, German, etc.) with a focus on English. The UAM CorpusTool is a set of tools for the semi-automatic annotation of text and images. It is designed by Mick O’Donnel. This tool is special because it allows annotation of a range of texts and a comparison of these texts. It also allows annotation at multiple linguistic levels (e.g., classifying the text as a whole according to its genre, tagging sections of text by function (e.g., abstract, introduction, etc.), tagging sentences/ clauses, tagging participants in clauses, tagging specific parts of speech (nouns, verbs, prepositions, etc.), studying the voice system, etc. Moreover, after the annotating stage, the tool automatically presents statistical tests like frequency distributions, chi-square significance test in case of comparison, lexical density, pronominal usage, word and segment length, etc. The tool also offers an interface of automatic annotation of Transitivity configurations, sentence structuring (e.g., Subj, Pred, Mood, Adjunct, etc.), etc. The tool is offered for free download in the following official website http://www.wagsoft.com/CorpusTool/</p>		<p>Online questionnaires are a valuable option for researchers to collect data as they allow access to wider audiences, increase response rates, and save on data collection costs and data-entry time. Therefore, it is important to assist the researchers with no/limited prior experience in designing online questionnaires with taking advantage of this option. This workshop therefore aims to introduce participants to the basics of designing online questionnaires using Google Forms. Its objective is to enable participants to (1) create questionnaire sections, (2) design different forms of open ended and pre-coded questions, and (3) visualize results. By the end of the workshop, participants are expected to be able to create an online questionnaire which includes sections containing open-ended and precoded questions, generate a questionnaire link, and then download results in MS Excel format.</p> <p>IMPORTANT: To attend the workshop, you need: - A fully charged laptop - A Google mail account.</p>
