NEW SCULPTURE

NEW YORK -A new sculpture of a modern young black man on a horse called "Rumors of War" by Kehinde Wiley is meant to be a response to Confederate statues, particularly to the JEB Stuart Monument on Monument Avenue in Richmond, Va.

Alex Nyerges, Virginia Museum of Fine Arts Director, said it was the sculptors first attempt at monumental sculpture. The sculpture is 27 feet tall and is one foot taller than the JEB Stuart monument.

The statue was unveiled in New York City recently and will go on permanent display in Richmond in December at the museum.

IMPORTANT WFSI RELICS

WILLOUGHBY, OH – A Confederate sword once owned by Captain C.P. Bowen of the 30th Georgia Infantry will be among the war relics auctioned by Milestone Auctions' October 5, at Willoughby, Ohio. There will be both live and internet bids accepted.

The accompanying Bowen archives auction value estimate is between \$10,000 and \$15,000. Bowen's name is etched onto the sword. Also etched on the sword is are two versions of the Confederate flag. Another War for Southern Independence item being auctioned is an 1861 mammoth-late albumen print of the famous 8th Wisconsin Infantry with live eagle mascot. 

Louisiana provided approximately 56,000 men to the Confederate Army during the War for Southern Independence. Additionally, about 10,000 boys and older men served in home-guard units and fought in various invasion campaigns during the war.

In addition, 982 military companies were raised in Louisiana for the Confederate Army. In addition, there were some 400 state militia companies raised for the war. --Source: Booth's Records.
