1 MUSEUM OF ARTS AND CRAFTS

Why Museum of Arts and Crafts is a *must see* museum?



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This grand Hermann Bollé-designed palace, founded in 1880, was originally based on 'a collection of samples for master craftsmen and artists who need to re-improve production of items of everyday use'. It has now grown to become the country's premier collection of applied art, with wide-ranging pieces from Baroque to Biedermeier furniture, domestic ceramics, clocks and contemporary poster design.

Permanent display 'Collection in Motion' and exhibition



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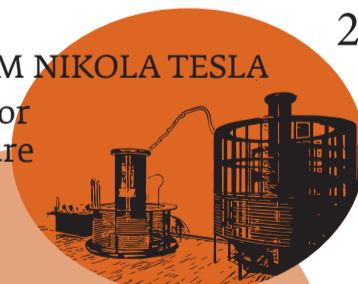

4 DRAŽEN PETROVIĆ MUSEUM AND MEMORIAL CENTER



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Dražen Petrović museum and memorial center is the only museum in the world dedicated to a single basketball player. It is situated on Dražen Petrović square and near basketball arena of the same name where Cibona plays. Permanent display of the museum contains multiple medals, including multiple Olympic medals, World and European championship gold medals, original jerseys, trophies and other basketball memorabilia from 80s and 90s.

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CROATIAN STATE ARCHIVES




Founded in 1643., the Croatian State Archives are keeping rich cultural heritage documenting the millenium past inside the secessionist Lubynski Palace. All of this rich cultural heritage is being preserved, processed and provided to citizenry at the Archives' main building on 21 Marulić square, the beautiful Lubynski palace (named after its architect, Rudolf Lubynski). Resplendent in rich decorum modelled after the ideals of Viennese Secession at its height, the Archives' building is one of the most impressive structures in the whole of Croatia, and not just on the outside. 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BLESSED ALOJZIJE STEPINAC 'A witness to the truth'



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Blessed Alojzije Stepinac, Archbishop of Zagreb and Cardinal, was born in 1898. in Krašić. He was ordained a priest in 1930. and appointed Archbishop in 1937. At the time of his political process, in 1946, the communist regime sentenced him to 16 years of prison and forced labor. Pope Pius XII announces Stepinac's elevation to a cardinal in 1953. He died in Krašić in 1960. on the note of holiness and martyrdom. He was buried in the cathedral of Zagreb. His grave is a place of constant prayer and listening. Pope John Paul II beatified him in Marija Bistrica, 1998.

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ATELIER MEŠTROVIĆ IN ZAGREB



The former home of Ivan Meštrović, the most famous Croatian sculptor

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Atelier Meštrović is an attractive exhibition space with a memorable character, located on the Upper Town of Zagreb, near the church of St. Mark's. An authentic environment of life and work of Ivan Meštrović (1883.-1962.) was preserved, one of the most famous Croatian sculptors, who studied in Vienna and lived, worked and exhibited in the artistic and cultural centers of Europe and the USA: Rome, Paris, Prague, London, Cannes, Geneva, Zagreb, Split, Chicago, New York etc. where his works are still today. Ivan Meštrović is the first Croatian artist to exhibit at the Victoria & Albert Museum in London (1915.) and at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York (1947.). At the Atelier Meštrović presented exhibits were created in the first four decades of Meštrović's creation, until he left Zagreb in 1942.

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MODERN GALLERY




On show in the permanent display, exhibited to the highest museological standards, are more than 750 classic works of painters, sculptors, medallists and new media artists that bear witness to the high points of Croatian fine art from the 19th century to the present day. The Modern Gallery is the national visual arts museum and has the richest collection of the fine arts in Croatia.

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ZAGREB CITY MUSEUM



The Zagreb City Museum, founded in 1907, is today the largest city museum in the Republic of Croatia. The Museum's permanent display was opened in 1998. Portraying the city, the museum conveys a message of Zagreb's identity and cultural heritage from ancient history (archaeological findings presented *in situ*) to the present day. The museum is wheelchair-friendly, while visually challenged and deaf-blind visitors have at their disposal the introductory texts for 45 topics and the catalogue printed in Braille.

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And with this motivation and slogan the Image of War Photography Museum opened its doors to visitors this August. The current exhibition, Up Close and Personal: War in Croatia, shows the destructive impacts of war from 1991 to 1995 in over 100 photos taken by professional Croatian, Serbian and world-renowned international photographers. Through photography, personal stories, documentaries and informative events visitors will not only experience the brutality of war but also be able to contribute to peace themselves. A portion of all tickets sold will be donated to refugees, whereas the eco-friendly shirts at the museum's shop are produced by a Croatian organization employing disabled and other socially-excluded people.
