LADBROKES CHAMPIONSHIP

Caley Thistle fell to a disappointing 3-0 defeat at Gayfield as goals from Scott Stewart, Bobby Linn and Omar Kader secured all three points for the Lichties.

John Robertson made four changes from last weekend's defeat against Dundee United as Brad McKay, Tom Walsh, Miles Storey and Nikolay Todorov came into the side for Shaun Rooney, Mitchell Curry, Aaron Doran and Jordan White.

Caley Thistle had the first chance of the match as James Keatings' corner met Tremarco in the box and his header was blocked. The rebound found its way to Donaldson but his shot was cleared off the line.

After 19 minutes, Mark Ridgers was called into action as he saved Scott Stewart's effort with his feet. The Lichties had the breakthrough after 28 minutes on the clock, after a great move from the home side, Scott Stewart fired a low strike past Ridgers from inside the box.

Caley Thistle looked to hit back immediately as Miles Storey looked to meet Brad McKay's long pass but Gaston came off his line to clear it.

In the second-half, Tom Walsh had a go from about 25 yards after the re-start but Gaston parried it clear.

Arbroath were then awarded a penalty kick after 53 minutes, Brad McKay was judged to have pulled down Colin Hamilton in the box.

Bobby Linn stepped up to cover the penalty to double the home sides' advantage.

After 86 minutes, Arbroath had their third of the match as Omar Kader tapped in at the back-post to seal all three points.

Mitch said: “There was a lot of relief from me when I scored in the last round. I was out for 11 weeks so to come back and score playing as the number nine it was really a great feeling. Hopefully I can do the same today if selected.”

“I love playing as the number 9, it is the position I have played all my life and that’s my natural position. I’m learning how to play on the left or the right but the number nine role is definitely my natural position so hopefully I get another chance playing there.”

ICTFC CODE OF CONDUCT

Inverness Caledonian Thistle FC will not tolerate unacceptable conduct at the Caledonian Stadium or any away football stadia.

Unacceptable conduct is conduct which is deemed violent or disorderly.

Violent conduct is any actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person, or intentional damage to property.

Disorderly conduct includes:

Conduct which stirs up or sustains or is likely to or is designed to stir up or sustain hatred or ill will towards people or groups of people based on their membership of the following categories:

- **Gender, Race, Nationality (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.**
- **Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.**
- **Sexual orientation**
- **Transgender Identity**
- **Disability**
- **Or against an individual who is perceived to be a part of such group**
- **Using threatening, abusive or insulting words or conduct**
- **Displaying or writing anything which is abusive or insulting**
- **Using words or conduct or displaying any writing or other thing which indicated the support or affiliation to, or the celebrating of, or opposition to an organisation or group proscribed in the terms of the terrorism act of 2000**

All persons entering The Caledonian Stadium on a matchday are subject to these rules, including employees and volunteers of ICTFC whilst discharging their duties.

Any person who engages in unacceptable conduct will be liable for sanctions imposed by the club, which may involve possible criminal proceedings, ejection from the stadium, withdrawal of a season ticket and/or exclusion from future matches at the club.
