Connect:

- 1) Share some of the most memorable traditions your family observes during Easter.
- 2) Share any new reflections you had this Easter season on the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Discuss:

Phil 2:3-11

- 1) What does it mean to do all to the glory of God? How do you go from a mindset of “it’s all about me” to a mindset of giving God the glory?
- 2) What does it mean “to consider” others more significant than yourself?” In considering others more significant or better than yourself, what does that look like in our marriage, families, job, and to those who don’t know Christ? How would a change in our thinking and the way we react bring a greater glory to God?
- 3) Christ was obedient, even to death on a cross. Christ was totally broken and gave no resistance – He poured out every power, privilege, pain and His final breath in obedience. What in your life are you resisting in order to be obedient to God? What would being obedient to Christ look like from the eyes of a friend, a family member, or a random stranger? If anything what should they see?
- 4) Why did God require a perfect sacrifice? What does He require of us?
- 5) Philippians 2: 10 and 11 says every knee shall bow at the end of the age. Why should we trust Him? What’s the danger with someone putting off the decision to accept Christ as Savior?
