I have had this for 5 years. I have had them removed quite easily 2 days ago and can barely see them already! The total effect is not expected for 2 weeks. I went to a skin clinician and used electrolysis. The NHS have done a study and have found it 100% effective. I paid £65 for one treatment. Depending how deep or large the area is depends on the cost. I think my money was well spent as I'm thrilled with result. Good luck x

I've just returned from advanced electrolysis on a large eyelid xanthelasma and after just 2 hours I'm already thrilled at the result. Felt a couple of needle picks then it was more discomfort than pain. I was warned it may take a couple of treatments but first indications are that it'll be completely gone after just this one. I'm aware it may come back but at £40 per treatment I'll just get it removed again. Worth every penny!

The process of electrolysis for the removal of Xanthelasma is a process I cannot recommend highly enough. After researching many methods of removal, most involving surgery, I decided to opt for the quick, relatively painless procedure which was completed within an hour, recovery was less than seven days and the results were outstanding. Cost wise, this procedure worked out about less than 10% of the average surgical cost and the recovery time was much quicker

It's crazy to think that I, like many others, had been led to believe that there was no treatment for Periorbital Xanthelasmas when in fact there are several. I looked at all the options and I'm really happy with the Advanced Electrolysis treatment because there is barely a mark now. It's quick and it can be repeated should the Xanthelasma reappear, which is really important when you consider that 40% of them do.

I never thought that I would ever have cosmetic treatment or that anything could be done about the xanthelasma that I had around my eyes - but the results have been better than I could have hoped for. This has been a real confidence booster!

I work with advanced cosmetic procedures using electrolysis and xanthalasma is quite a common treatment that I work with. Although harmless, the blemishes can be very upsetting for those who have them. Advanced electrology results are excellent, initially the xanthalasma is of a flatter appearance after treatment, then a scab forms which should be left alone. When this is healed, we then can see the results. Further treatment may or may not be necessary depending on the size of the xanthalasma and how deeply into the tissue it is embedded. NHS have classified that advanced electrology is 100% effective for xanthalasma.

I had a small xanthelasma in the corner of the eye orbit. I had it removed easily and effectively by advanced electrolysis (cost £48). Apart from a small scab for about 10 days which was barely noticeable I encountered no problems or scarring. No recurrence so far (3 months on). Not sure if bigger ones or if closer to eyes would be amenable to treatment but might be worth investigating if you have this problem.

I have Xanthelasma on my eyelids and below each eye. For years I have detested them but when I asked at the doctors how they could be removed I was told nothing could be done on the NHS and I would have to have cosmetic surgery which could leave scars. I thought I would have to put up with them for the rest of my life and used makeup to hide them as much as I could. Recently I made a new friend in my village, she was trained in electrolysis and has just completed a course in advanced electrolysis. My right eye was treated 2 weeks ago using advanced electrolysis and the Xanth has almost gone. I had me other eye treated today and it already looks better. It is not a permanent solution but I am happy to have the treatment once or twice a year. No one needs to put up with these, advanced electrolysis is quick, a little painful and relatively inexpensive treatment. I am amazed and so much happier!
