

House Study Bill 2 Draft #2

A Bill For

1 An act relating to inquiry and requirements of medical treatment of an
2 individual including vaccinations.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA.

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1 Section 1

2 In this section: Definitions

3 (1) “Medical Treatment” means a health care treatment, service, or
4 procedure designed to maintain or treat a patient’s physical or mental
5 condition, as well as preventative care and medical devices.

6 Section 2: Inquiry and requirements of medical treatment of an
7 individual including vaccinations.

8 (a) Persons shall not inquire about an individual's medical treatment
9 status including vaccination status nor shall persons maintain a record of
10 an individual's vaccination status with the exception of medical records
11 necessary for the care and treatment of an individual

12 (b) Discrimination based on medical treatment status including
13 vaccination status or possession of immunity passport prohibited. It is
14 unlawful discriminatory practice for a person or governmental entity to:

15 (1) [Services] refuse, withhold from, or deny to a person any local or
16 state services, goods, facilities, advantages, privileges, access,
17 transportation or freedom of movement, licensing, educational
18 opportunities, health care access based on the medical treatment
19 status including vaccination status or whether the person has a
20 immunity passport;

21 (2) [Incentives or Disincentives] provide or disallow incentives such
22 as coupons, free goods or services, lotteries and games of chance, or
23 to impose a monetary fine or tax, or any other socioeconomic
24 disincentive;

25 (3) [Employment] refuse to hire or employ a citizen, bar or
26 discharge a citizen from employment, impose a surcharge or pay cut,
27 discriminate against a citizen in compensation or in a term,
28 condition, or privileges of employment based on the medical
29 treatment status including vaccination status or whether the person
30 has an immunity passport;

31 (4) [Segregation and privacy rights] exclude, limit, segregate, refuse
32 to serve, require a facial covering or other vaccination status label
33 for, require additional testing, or otherwise discriminate against a
34 person based on the citizen’s vaccination status or whether the
35 citizen has an immunity passport.

36 (c) Notwithstanding any other law, each appropriate state agency shall
37 ensure that businesses in this state comply with the above sections and

1 shall require compliance with those subsections as a condition for license,
2 permit, or other state authorization necessary for conducting business in
3 this state.

4 (d) A person who violates subsection (b) is liable for any adverse reactions,
4 injuries, disabilities, or death that is or may be related to the individual
5 receiving forced medical treatment including vaccines, it shall be
6 presumed, in absence of any substantial evidence to the contrary, that
7 such adverse reaction, injury, disability, or death arose in the course of the
8 employment.

9 Section 3: If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or
10 circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions
11 or applications held this Act that can be given effect without the invalid
12 provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are
13 declared severable.

14 Section 4: “The provisions of this section prevail over any conflicting
15 provisions in a general law, present or future, to the extent of the conflict,
16 but if any such general law contains a specific exemption from this section,
17 including a specific reference to this section, such general law prevails, but
18 only to the extent of the exemption.”

19 Section 5: EFFECTIVE DATE. This act, being deemed of immediate
20 importance, takes effect upon enactment.

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
