What advice you want to give to your admirers?

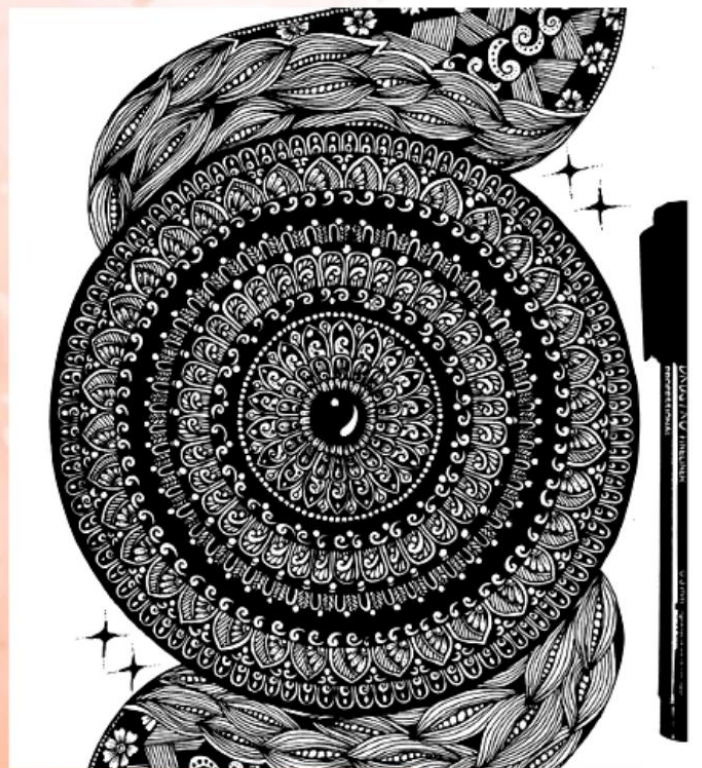

Ladyzadzakiya is my inspiration.

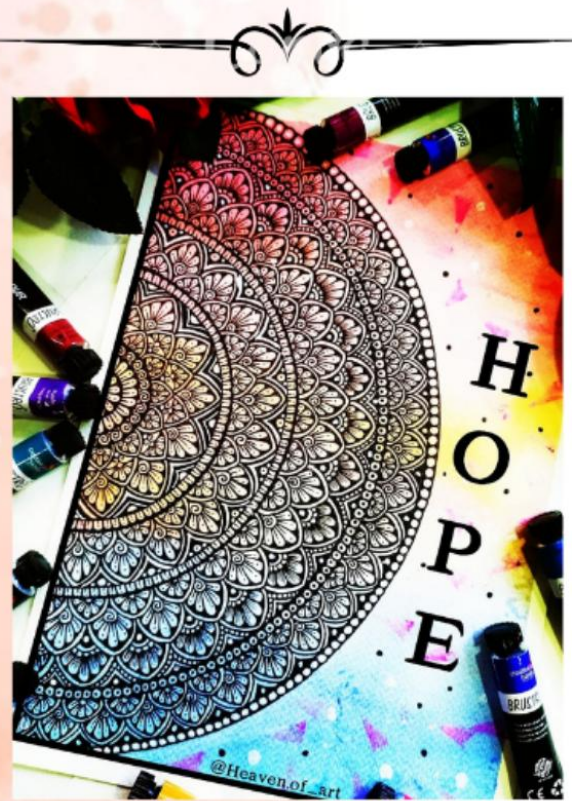
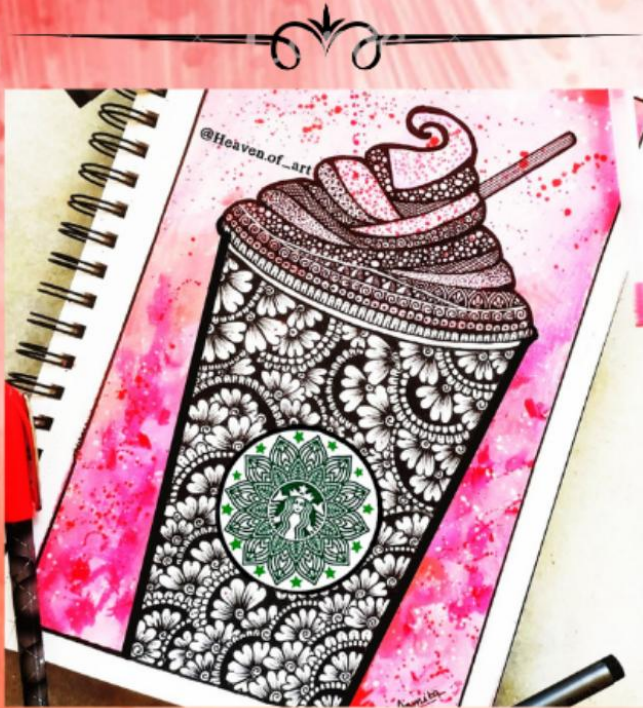

Karishma srivastava, aarti amonkar, lalita aiyer these artists inspires me a lot.

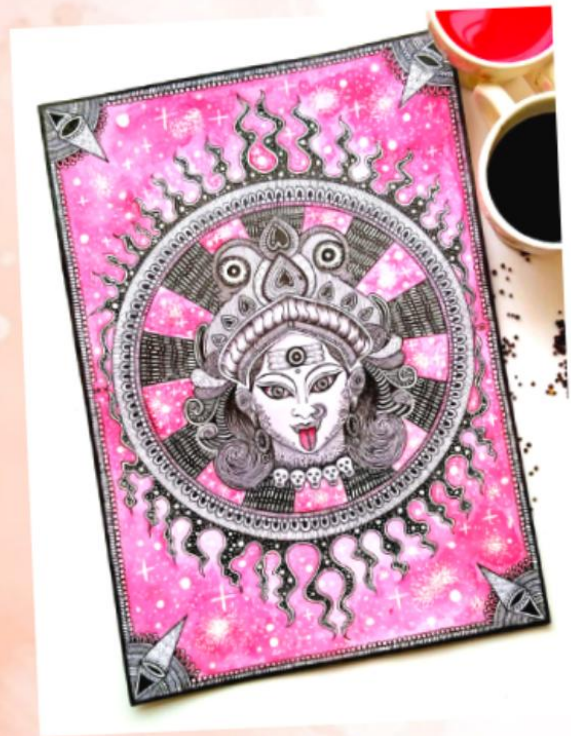
What advice you want to give to your admirers?

There are many Artists from whom I am inspired, but my passion for mandala started when I saw artworks of Kalakriti by karishma. She is my inspiration.

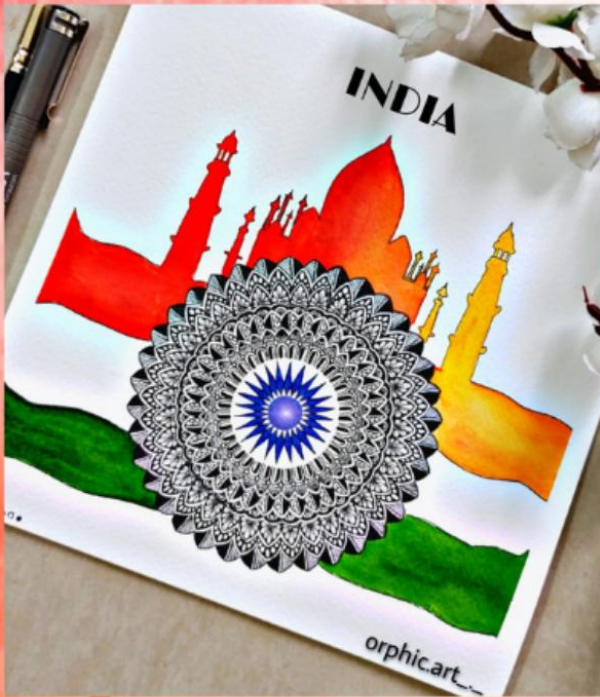
What advice you want to give to your admirers?

What advice you want to give to your admirers?

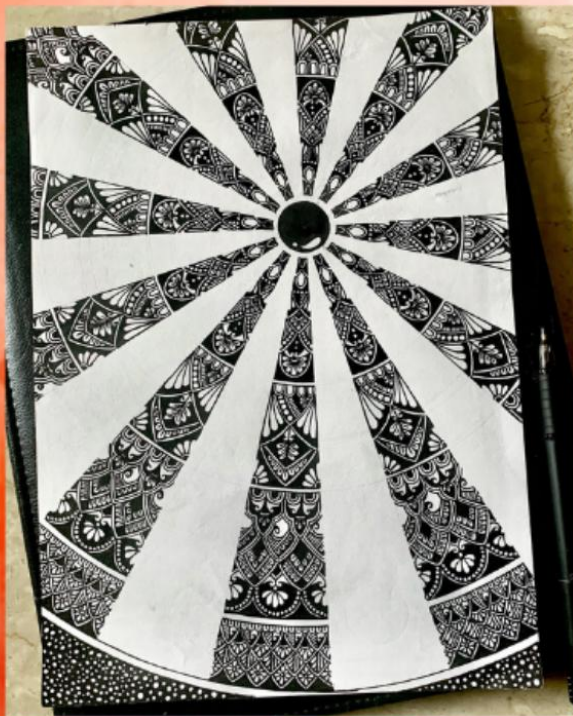
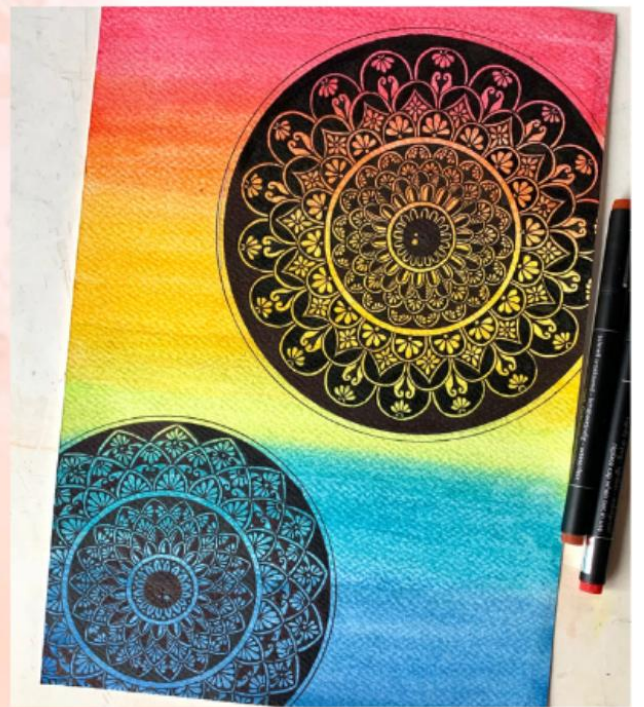
Learn from someone's art, be inspired but don't copy it exactly. You cannot grow huge with someone else's journey. You have got to create your own success.

Aarti R. Amonkar and Saudamini Madra (mandala artist) inspires me the most.

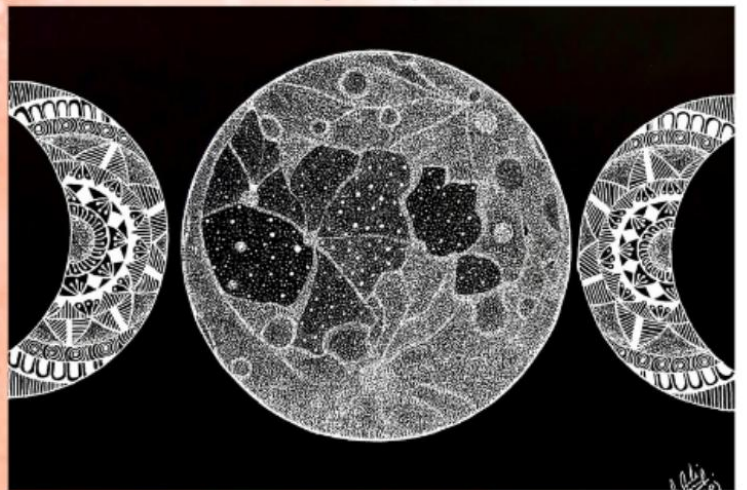
What advice you want to give to your admirers?

What advice you want to give to your admirers?

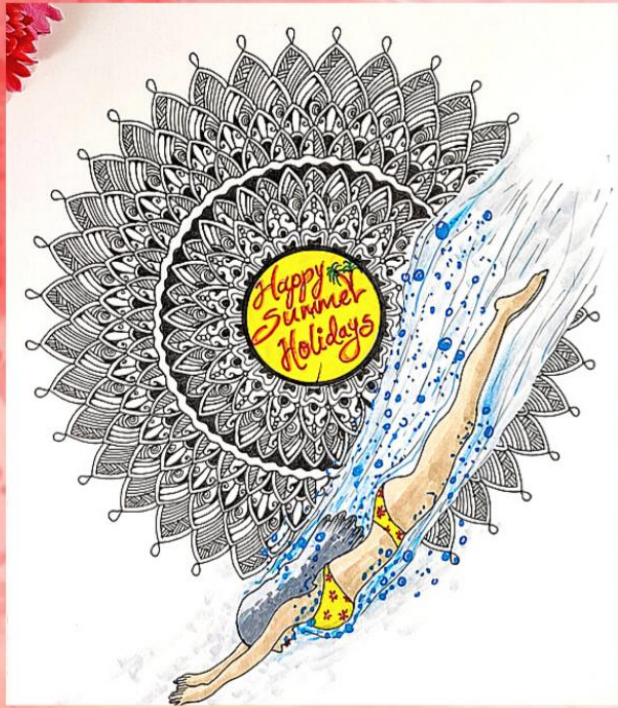

What advice you want to give to your admirers?

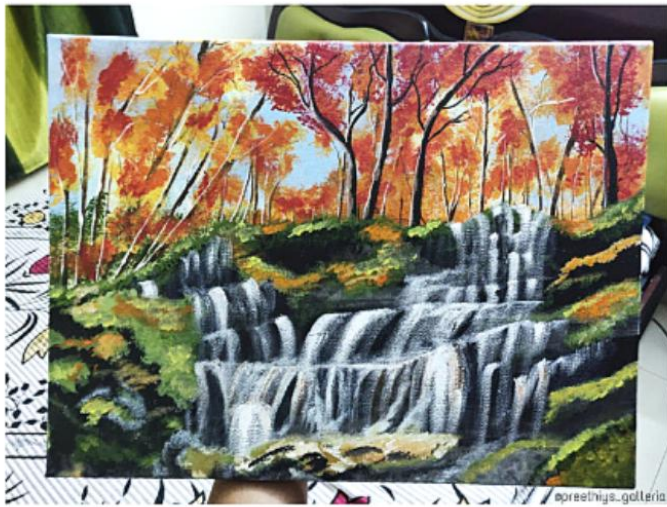
