

# How To Get Your Car Road Trip Ready | Basic Car Maintenance



If you are going to be driving for a long time in the car, it is important to keep it in good condition. For example, when you are driving on the road trip, you will be using your car for many things. You need to make sure that your car does not get damaged or dirty.

## **If you're heading out on a road trip, here are some basic steps to keep your car in tip-top shape:**

- 1. Check your oil and change it if necessary.** Most cars can go for about 300 miles between changes. If you're going more than that, check your manual for recommended mileage intervals before you go out of town. An engine can bog down quickly when there isn't enough lubricant circulating through it.
- 2. Check tire pressure.** The recommended pressure should be listed in your owner's manual or on the door jamb of the driver's side door; if not, check online or with a local shop (or just ask around).
- 3. Check the fluid levels in your windshield washer fluid and power steering fluid reservoirs** (if applicable). If you have automatic transmission in your rental from <https://rentalcarsuae.com/>, this is also a good time to check for leaks at the transmission dipstick before leaving town you

don't want to get stranded on the side of the road because you didn't know that drain plug was leaking!

**4.** Check all fluids and water levels in your cooling system: radiator coolant, brake flush and antifreeze (fill up if needed), power steering fluid (change if needed), windshield washer.

## **Make sure all vehicle lights are working properly**

When you leave home, make sure all lights work properly (such as headlights, taillights and interior lights) so that you can see clearly at night or during bad weather conditions (rain, snow or fog). You should also check if there are any broken bulbs that need replacing before leaving home. If there are any broken lights, replace them immediately so that they don't become a hazard while driving down the road!

**some basic car maintenance tips that will help your vehicle run smoothly and safely:**

## **Change the Oil**



Changing your oil regularly is a must. Check your owner's manual to make sure you're doing this before your trip. If not, do it at least once per month. You should change the oil every 5,000

miles (8,000 km). If you don't have an oil change scheduled yet, check out our article on how to change an engine oil filter.

## **Check Brakes**

Your brakes should be inspected every 6 months or so. Make sure they're working properly by pressing down on the brake pedal and making sure they don't go too far down or up. Also check if they're squeaking when you apply pressure to them (this is common among older cars). If they are broken or malfunctioning, replace them right away!

## **Check Engine Oil Level**

If your car has an automatic transmission, check the level of its engine oil every time you fill up with fuel! The dipstick should be almost in the middle of its slot not too high.

## **Change Your Tires**

If you own a four-wheel drive vehicle, changing its tires will save money on fuel costs and reduce wear and tear on other parts of your vehicle as well. It's important that all four tires are inflated properly when checking them before setting out on a long trip so they don't wear down too much during travel time.
