Hypernova Megaways Slot Review -RTP 96.09%



You must be very interested in the game **Hypernova Megaways**. ReelPlay was founded in 2014 and is a Sydney-based Australian company that was once known as Chance Interactive.

ReelPlay has not been able to garner much attention up to this point, and their portfolio is still fairly small, despite the fact that two of their games, Buster Hammer and Buster Hammer Carnival, have received some recognition in the casino industry.

As luck would have it, aggregator Relax Gaming secured a Megaways license in 2018, allowing its partner firms, including ReelPlay, to fully utilize the renowned gaming engine. The Megaways game engine has, as we've seen in the past, been fairly helpful to most studios, big and small, with each release continuing to generate a lot of buzz.

A Review of Hypernova Megaways Slot

The first Megaways slot developed by ReelPlay is titled Hypernova Megaways. It may initially appear to be just another Bonanza clone, and in some ways it is, but there are enough changes to distinguish it entirely.

The setup is fundamentally known to anyone who hasn't been living under a rock for the previous two to three years. It has 6 reels, up to 117,649 ways to win, cascading reels, and uses those features. It is a tribute to the wonders of the universe and is playable on all platforms from 0.40 to \notin/\pounds 60 per spin.



1. Game Symbols

Visually, Hypernova Megaways transports you to a location outside of our solar system. The reels are set inside a supernova and lit by neon lights, with a gorgeous, almost tear-inducing soundtrack that sounds like it could have been written by Hans Zimmer.

Golden lower-value 9, 10, J, Q, K, and A royals, as well as a trio of diamonds, can be found spinning on the reels. The diamond is the most lucrative symbol, paying out 10 times your wager for six of them over a complete payline. <u>Fishin Frenzy demo</u> slot also has the same beneficial symbols

2. Game Features

Using the well-known gaming engine that Big Time Gaming originally created, symbols on the reels range from 2 to 7 on each spin, giving the game a maximum of 117,649 ways to win.

Additionally, there is a second horizontal reel above the primary ones to aid in creating winning combinations; this is the only place where wild symbols can show up.

With the Cascading Reels feature seen in Hypernova Megaways, winning combinations trigger a chain reaction that results in the winning symbols being swapped out for fresh ones. In essence, it gives you the opportunity to win numerous times from a single spin.

In terms of the major features, ReelPlay has gone a different route than most other Megaways inventions by substituting a jackpot game for conventional free spins. Watch out for the supernova scatter symbols in the base game that have monetary values associated with them.

When six or more of these appear in the field of view, the Jackpot Respin feature is activated, and three respins are given. All supernova scatter s

Final Words

In all honesty, Hypernova Megaways is one of the weakest Megaways slots we've played so far. We know it's not enjoyable to say this. ReelPlay has a lot of potential, particularly in the aesthetic area, but the core gameplay is too formulaic and too reminiscent of the majority of other Megaways games to hold our attention for too long.

ReelPlay makes a valiant effort to think of something original by choosing a respin feature over free spins. Sadly, it could never succeed.

We believe that allowing the respin option to function as a distinct bonus game in addition to the free spins feature would have been a better strategy, but everyone's opinion is different. However, if you like a mining gold themed game, check out the <u>Gold Frenzy demo play</u>.
