

TALKS TRYING TO BREAK INTO THE SIDE



Charlie Trafford is hoping for a Caley Thistle response this afternoon as we face Ayr Utd after losing our last two matches against Ross County and Queen of the South.

Charlie has said the moral in the camp is positive and high as everyone is pulling together and focusing on turning results around. Results have been the issue for the Caley Jags recently after encouraging performances.

Looking forward to today's game, Trafford said: "It is always exciting playing one of the sides above you in the league, it puts a lot of pressure on the game and with results not being the best for us right now."

"We're still close enough that we are in touching distance but it's an important game for us, I think the boys are excited for it and training has been good this week so we're looking forward to getting going."

The Canadian continued: "There's been a lot of talk that we've been playing well but the results are not coming so it's about tinkering I guess and getting things right."

"Everyone's moral is coming back up after few days of it being down but everyone is looking forward to getting going again and getting us back on the right track."

Trafford has made 16 appearances for the Caley Jags this season but has been mainly on the bench recently. The midfielder wants to remain ready when called upon and is pulling together with the rest of the squad.

Trafford said: "I'm just trying to stay ready whenever the chance comes. Obviously it's really frustrating, it's even worse when the results aren't going our way, we're losing matches and you are sitting there helplessly. It's frustrating but it is a team game so I'm just being patient and going from there."

Caley Thistle have made one January signing in the form of Kevin McHattie and Trafford has been

impressed with him in training so far this season as he praised the former Derry and Hearts player.

Trafford said: "He's brilliant technically, he's very good with the ball and left footed so he's something a bit more attacking but he's also very solid defensively. I think it is a very good addition to the side so it strengthens the side even more and gives us a bit of depth, I'm looking forward to seeing what he can do for us."

Caley Thistle may be quite short in numbers this afternoon with Brad Mckay and Shaun Rooney suspend, while other players are doubt with injuries and sickness. Trafford said: "One of the difficulties of coming up to this stage of the season is there will be a lot of injuries, suspensions and all that to deal with. It's about banding and sticking together as a squad to get through these tough period and hopefully we bounce back today."



Carl Tremarco made his first appearance since October as he replaced the suspended Shaun Rooney in the starting eleven. New signing Kevin McHattie made an appearance on the bench.

Liam Polworth had the first chance for the Caley Jags but his effort was held by Martin while Queens had a chance moments later as Doyle picked out Todd but his effort was over the bar.

Walsh then picked out White in the box but Scott Mercer cleared the ball off the line. White then saw another effort saved by Martin while Walsh hit the underside of the crossbar as he was inches away from giving the Caley Jags the lead.

After the break, Coll Donaldson hit the post with a diving header after meeting a corner from Joe Chalmers, as Brad Mckay couldn't turn the rebound in.

Caley Thistle finally got the lead they deserved on the 69th minute as Tremarco's cross was flicked on by White to Walsh, who's volley flew past Martin.

## ICTFC CODE OF CONDUCT

Inverness Caledonian Thistle FC will not tolerate unacceptable conduct at the Tullloch Caledonian Stadium or any away football stadia.

Unacceptable conduct is conduct which is deemed violent or disorderly.

Violent conduct is any actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person, or intentional damage to property.

**Disorderly conduct includes:** 

Conduct which stirs up or sustains or is likely to or is designed to stir up or sustain hatred or ill will towards people or groups of people based on their membership of the following categories:

- Gender, Race, Nationality (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.
- Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.
- Sexual orientation
- Transgender Identity
- Disability
- Or against an individual who is perceived to be a part of such group
- Using threatening, abusive or insulting words or conduct
- Displaying or writing anything which is abusive or insulting
- Using words or conduct or displaying any writing or other thing which indicated the support or affiliation to, or the celebrating of, or opposition to an organisation or group proscribed in the terms of the terrorism act of 2000

All persons entering the Tulloch Caledonian Stadium on a matchday are subject to these rules, including employees and volunteers of ICTFC whilst discharging their duties.

Any person who engages in unacceptable conduct will be liable for sanctions imposed by the club, which may involve possible
