

SECTION A: THEFT, ROBBERY AND PIRACY AT SEA (TRAPS)

05 May - Sea Theft/ STAR GLORY/ Bulk Carrier/ Cayman Island Flagged/ Anchored/ Muara Berau Anchorage, Indonesia/ DB080520

1. A sea theft incident occurred on board a Cayman Island flagged bulk carrier "STAR GLORY" while anchored at Lat: 0°15'51.00"S Long: 117°35'4.80"E Muara Berau Anchorage, Indonesia on 052330 (UTC +8), May 20.

3. Incident Details:

Duty crew on routine rounds onboard an anchored ship noticed the forward hatch at the forecastle opened. Upon inspection, it was discovered that the security padlock was broken, and ship's stores stolen. Incident reported to the Port Authorities and the local agent.

04 May - Piracy / TORM LOTTE/ Chemical Tanker / Danish Flagged/ Anchored/ Off Pulau Bintan, South China Sea/ DB050520

1. IFC has received information from master of TORM LOTTE, Danish flagged chemical tanker, that the vessel was boarded by 4 armed perpetrators with long knives while anchored at $1^{\circ}36'42.0"N$ $104^{\circ}52'48.0"E$, northeast of Pulau Bintan in South China Sea at 0350 (UTC + 8) on 4 May 20.

f. Type: Chemical Tanker

3. At 0350LT, Duty personnel informed bridge on the sighting of perpetrators and Duty Officer raised alarm immediately. Upon sounding the alarm, the 4 perpetrators escaped in a 6-metre wooden boat with 2 other perpetrators onboard. Crew mustered and carry out a search, no other perpetrator was found. All crew reported safe and one walkie talkie was taken away from the Duty personnel when he encountered the perpetrators. The ship master informed the company security department and local agent based in Singapore. Master also alerted all other vessels in vicinity on MMS.

IFC RECOMMENDATIONS

IFC advises:

- 1. All mariners to report any incidents timely to the nearest coastal state and to the IFC at the earliest possible time.
- 2. Ships moving at slow speed or are choosing to remain at anchor in areas where sea robbery/theft is regularly reported should remain vigilant and adopt necessary and/or added security measures.
- 3. All mariners to take note on the description of the perpetrators and to take photos of the perpetrators if possible. Where available, CCTV footage capturing the incident should be provided to the coastal state authorities for follow-on investigation.
- 4. Shippers and Seafarers operating in the Sulu-Celebes seas are strongly recommended to be vigilant and to establish contact with the Philippines, Malaysian and Indonesian Authorities to report their presence. Please refer to IFC Spot Commentary 4/18 for the latest assessment of the situation in that affected area.
- 5. Shippers are advised to take note that the threat of terrorist activity in the maritime domain remains a possibility in the region due to ISIS and the Al-Qaeda. The possibility of this threat was previously quoted in Al-Qaeda's online magazine "Resurgence", which called for the disruption of global trade and shipping through acts of piracy, among other tactics. Shippers are therefore advised to exercise vigilance and to adopt self-defensive measures as stated in the Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery against Ships in Asia, especially when transiting narrow choke points and areas which are known to have experienced incidents of sea robbery/piracy.
