


Participants expectations of the training.

 Majority of the participants expected that after the training their knowledge on factchecking, tools for fact-checking, SDGs, journalism, and how to deliver accurate information will be increased.


Knowledge of SDGs before and after the training.




Knowledge of SDGs on its usefulness to journalist before and after the training.


