Academic planning for College and Career Readiness

Students' should plan, prepare and take rigorous academic courses that connect to their college and career aspirations.

Important facts to remember for college readiness:

- ❖ MAP scores
- PSAT Score
- ❖ SAT Score
- Enrollment and Completion of AP courses

- Help students to take college/career classes while still in high school (online classes, summer courses...)
- Research college specific acceptance requirements
- Give your child an opportunity to explore their interest

Enrichment and Extracurricular Engagement

Expose your child to a wide range of extracurricular and enrichment opportunities that build leadership, nurture talents and interests, and increase engagement with the community

Important facts to remember for college readiness:

- Participation in enrichment programs (academic support, makerspace, summer programs..)
- Participation in extracurricular programs (sports, MUN, GIN, Debate, NHS, NAHS...)
- Students in Leadership position in enrichment and/or extracurricular programs

- Help students to develop portfolios that include their certificates, attendance record, artwork...
- Create and use academic and activity calendar as time management tool for planning and scheduling
- Support, mentor or sponsor enrichment activities

College and Career Exploration and Selection Processes

Provide early and ongoing exposure to experiences and information necessary to make informed decisions when selecting a college or career

Important facts to remember for college readiness:

- Participation in college and career exploration program
- Shadowing, volunteer and internship opportunities

- Participate in college and career exploration programs that take place in the city
- Have an open and transparent communication about affordability, expectations and future plans
- Connect your child to mentors and professionals for shadowing experience

College and Career Assessments

Promote preparation, participation and performance in college and career assessments
