








Our students are growing their learning muscles!

CONFERENCES

The upcoming Parent Teacher Conferences will be held the week of February 20^{th} .

Conferences are highly valuable and a great time for collaboration. They offer parents the opportunity to find out how their student is growing academically, getting along with classmates, how they're progressing in school, and what can be done at home to build upon strengths and overcome challenges.

Again this year, all elementary school parents will schedule conference times online. Each teacher or teacher team has a schedule particular to them. If your child is in a combination class or if your child's switch class is a different grade level, look under "MIX" instead of the particular grade level.

The Conference Scheduler will open for families on MONDAY, FEBRUARY 5th. Scheduling early offers you the opportunity to secure conference times that work best for your family, *particularly if you have multiple students at one school*. We have two computers in the office if you need to use them.

*******Tip for families with more than one student: Open two windows in your browser so that you can look at schedules side-by-side.

2018 PEAKS State Assessment

The Performance Evaluation for Alaska's Schools (PEAKS) is Alaska's summative assessment administered to students in Grades 3-9 (English language arts and mathematics) and grades 4, 8 and 10 (science) each spring. The purpose of a large-scale, summative assessment is to provide parents and schools an overall picture of a student's progress in meeting the Alaska standards at his/her grade level. The assessment is taken on the computer and is not timed, but each content area takes approximately 100-180 minutes.

Parents can locate resources for the PEAKS assessment, including directions for PEAKS Practice tests, called Online Tools Training and PEAKS Tutorials (under Frequently Asked Questions), on the ASD website at www.asdk12.org/PEAKS.

Parents can also help by ensuring their children are well rested, eat a nutritious breakfast, and are at school on time for the days of testing. Please avoid scheduling appointments on your child's testing days.

The PEAKS testing window below provides a framework for which weeks are used for testing at each grade level.

Grades	State of Alaska Designated Testing Weeks
3 and 7	March 26-30
4 and 8	April 2-6
5 and 9	April 9-13
6 and 10	April 16-20

Please plan for all 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students to be on time every day during this window.
