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HOW TO SET SCREEN RULES THAT STICK

The guidelines given on the site below are common sense and well worth a read. Some parents establish an informal contract with their children and their allotted screen time - this is also a worthwhile exercise since the children have ownership in determining the dos and don'ts and are more likely to adhere to them. Bottom line is we are all role models, and showing an interest in everything your child does (virtual or not) is the key ingredient.

In many homes, getting kids to turn off their cell phones, shut down the video games, or log off of Facebook can incite a revolt. And if your kids say they need to be online for schoolwork, you may not know when the research stops and idle activity begins.

It may seem counterintuitive, but getting involved with your kids' media is the first step to cutting the cord. Showing an interest, knowing what they're doing -- even playing along with them -- makes it easier to know how much is too much.

Every family will have different amounts of time that they think is "enough." What's important is giving it some thought, creating age-appropriate limits (with built-in flexibility for special circumstances), making media choices you're comfortable with, and modeling responsible screen limits for your kids.

Preschoolers. There are lots of great TV shows, apps, games, and websites geared for this age. But too much time spent in front of a screen interferes with the activities that are essential for growing brains and bodies.

Go for quality and age-appropriateness. Not everything for preschoolers needs to be a so-called "brain-builder," but there's a difference between mindless and mindful entertainment. Our learning ratings can steer you toward titles that help preschoolers work on developmental skills like sharing, cooperation, and emotional intelligence.

Sit with them, and enjoy the discovery process. There will always be moments when you need to rely on the TV or an app to distract your preschooler while you get something done. But as much as you can, enjoy media together. Little hands and developing brains really benefit from your company (and guidance!).

Begin setting limits when kids are little. Habits get ingrained early, so make sure you establish clear screen-time rules when your kids are young. For games, apps, and websites, you may need to set a timer. For TV, just say "one show."

Elementary and Middle Schoolers. At this age, kids love TV shows, games, movies, and online videos. They begin to explore more and hear about new shows and games from friends. Because they can access these things by themselves, it's crucial to continue to supervise their activities and help them stick to your rules.

Start with an endpoint. Use whatever tools you have -- your DVR, Netflix, OnDemand -- to prerecord shows, cue them up, or plan ahead to watch at a specific time. That way, one show won't flow into the other, and you can avoid commercials. If your kids are into YouTube, search for ageappropriate videos, and add them to a playlist to watch later. Because most games don't have built-in endings (and are, in fact, designed to make kids play as long as possible), set a timer or some other cue that says "time to stop."

Help them balance their day. Kids this age need guidance from you on a daily plan that includes a little bit of time for everything. And staying involved works: Kids whose parents make an effort to limit media use spend less time with media than their peers do, according to a 2010 Kaiser Family Foundation study.

Practice what you preach. It's tempting to keep reaching for your phone to check email, texts, Facebook, or the news. But your kids will be the first to call you out for not "walking the talk." Plus, they'll pick up habits from you. Model the media behavior that you want your kids to emulate.

High Schoolers. You'll have more success with teens if you explain the reasons why too much screen time is harmful. For example, too much exposure to violent video games raises aggression and lowers empathy.

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Your kids may actually be able to see evidence of this in their peers who spend too much time playing games. Even Facebook is a habit that some teens wish they could break.

Help them make quality choices. You still have a say in what they see, hear, and play. Put in your two cents about the importance of quality shows, games, and movies.

Crack down on multitasking. High school kids who've discovered texting, IM, Facebook, and music tend to do them all at once -- especially when they're supposed to be doing mundane tasks like homework. But a University of Michigan study found that humans are terrible multitaskers and that the practice actually reduces the ability to concentrate and focus.

Find ways to say "yes." Look for movies they can watch. Find games you're OK with. If your teens ask to see something you don't approve of, help them find alternatives.

The Sound Wave Model-Experiment

We learned that sound is a vibration, or wave, that travels through matter (solid, liquid, or gas) and can be heard.

How does sound move or propagate?

We answered this questions by making a model of a sound wave machine. The group gathered all the materials such as bunch of drinking straws, and sticky tapes to make the wave models. We cut about three meters of sticky tape and keep it on the floor with the sticky side up. Then we marked the mid points of straws and place them on the middle of the sticky tape, uniformly. Every straw is two centimeters from the previous straw. Then we left five centimeters tape for the handle.

We remove the straw from the floor and lifted the straw waves and the other members of the group hold the other end and gave a tap from one end.

In our observation we saw a reflected wave coming from the other. If you hold the straw loosely then the speed of the wave became slower. If you hold tightly, the waves travel much faster. We also twisted on both the ends and slowly saw the troughs and crests emerging, low points, high points, and the wavelength. In a certain length, the numbers of waves depict the frequency.

Our conclusion is that through our created Sound Machine project we easily understand a great deal about waves. If we give a tap on one end, a reflected waves comes back, it's a transmission of energy not matter.

How To Do Side Kick In Taekwondo

The sidekick is one of the most powerful strikes in martial arts. It is also relatively safe from counterattack because you are turned sideways.

So first, stand sideways to the target and lift the knee of your front leg. Your ankle should be flexed and the blade of your foot should be ready to strike. The blade of your foot is the outside edge, which you will use to strike your target. When you lift your knee you should be pointing your heel at the target.

Next, drive your knee out towards your target and extend full, straighten your leg and bring your foot to the body height of the opponent. You should try to get as much of your sole facing the ground as possible, so think of your big toe lifting you and your little toes pointing down.

Then bend your knee again and place it on the ground, bend the knee back to its original position before bringing your leg down to the ground.

How to Paint a Galaxy

Do you like to see the stars in the night sky? If so then this article is just for you! Here you are going to be reading how to paint a galaxy! Just by mixing watercolors together, you can make a beautiful artwork! It can also be very useful when you have an art project to submit. □

Have you ever seen other artworks relating to the topic galaxy? If so, then you might have noticed that this artwork requires a lot of color blending which is what makes a galaxy artwork look unique. Do not worry; you would not also have to spend so much money.

First, prepare all the materials needed. Buy a set of watercolors; make sure that dark blue, light blue, pink, purple, and black paints are there. Buy a canvas or just regular thick paper. Prepare both of your brushes and fill a container with water.

Next, start painting light blue in different areas of the canvas/thick paper, be sure to add plenty of water, but also be careful not to overdo it or the paper might tear apart. After applying the light blue paint start applying the light purple paint, make the two-colors mix a bit, so it looks cool. Then, add a light pink paint and mix it with the purple. After purple, add dark blue and make sure to fill the entire place. After filling the page let it dry before moving to the next.

Then get ready to use a little bit of black paint. F.Y.I. Every coating will have to be painted darker than the previous one. Before applying the black paint, add a little water to the area you want to paint. After that, start mixing black and dark blue together....remember, not too much black. Add the mixture to the canvas/thick paper on the area you added dark blue on your first coating. Next, add purple and mix it with the blue... only a little bit. Then start adding pink and light blue, remember to fill the page and let it dry again.

Continue applying paint with a darker shade by mixing black or dark blue after it has dried up. Make sure that on your final coating the canvas/ thick paper already looks like a galaxy...but without the stars.

After your final coating is complete, get your small brush, dip it in the white paint, and with your finger flick the brush backwards so it splatters on the galaxy like stars [!]! Also, do not overdo the star creating or your galaxy you just finished creating would not look like a galaxy anymore.

Finally, let it dry and be patient. After 20-30 minutes, your painting would be complete. Now you know how to paint a galaxy! Your very own art project! Ella, G-6 Explorers

How to Play Dodgeball

Do you know dodgeball? The game is typically played among ages 6 to 12. However, nowadays it's also becoming popular in high school. It is simple to play with the objective to eliminate other people out by throwing a ball at them while staying alive. You can play it anywhere or you can use a court that is easy to make.

All you need to play it is just four cones for the court, a dodgeball/s, and a duct tape (optional) to mark sides. Either you can choose to play outdoors or indoors in which case you do not need to make the court. You can also choose to use one ball or more.

In order to make the court, you would need to first plan the size of the court you would prefer. Then you put one cone in each corner to form a rectangle. And there you go! You got your court and you are ready to start playing!

Put the ball/s aligned with the "duct tape line". Once the game starts, both of the teams rush to get the ball/s in the middle. The team with the ball can start throwing. When one match ends, each team switches roles so it would be fair.
