# **BACKGROUND & NEEDS**

# Impact Statement

#### Accomplishments

- 1.In 2017 SAL was able to significantly reduce its administrative expenses.
- 2. SAL established a new program called Good Eats, which is designed to broaden students' culinary experiences, and offer them guidance on healthy food choices.
- 3. SAL provided unique experiential education opportunities to all participants, who were challenged to overcome personal obstacles of varying degrees. These "lightbulb moments" occurred during team-building at the obstacle course, at the Alpine Tower, on horseback, or any number of other activities facilitated by our deputies.

#### Goals

- 1.SAL hopes to begin offering services to students at Sarasota Middle School.
- 2.SAL hopes to re-establish the Capture Your World photography program at all locations.
- 3. SAL will be actively seeking short and long-term opportunities and avenues for our aspiring juvenile philanthropists.
- 4. SAL hopes to establish a new, law enforcement-related, adventure race-type fundraiser in the Spring of 2018.

# Background Statement

Since February 2012 SAL programs have provided services to over 500 elementary, middle, and high school students from Newtown to North Port. Our youth are our future! Every child regardless of race, color, creed, gender, or life circumstances should have the opportunity to succeed and make a positive contribution to society. The positive interaction between our youth and members of the Sarasota County Sheriff's Office, and other local law enforcement agencies will have a lasting and direct effect on their lives. Sarasota SAL is currently offering its activities to students in afterschool programs at Venice, Booker, Laurel-Nokomis and McIntosh Middle Schools, and collaborates with several other youth groups throughout Sarasota County. Our slogan, "Connecting Kids to the Community" is reflective of the experiential education philosophy on which SAL programs are based. Two popular theories indicate that young people often do not fully realize their potential because: they for some reason are not connected to their community, and/or they at least perceive that their conventional means to success is being impeded. To help overcome these obstacles the goal of Sarasota SAL is to expose youth from all over Sarasota County to as many positive activities and aspects of our diverse community as possible. The programs will focus on cultivating interest in the activity itself, team-building, developing communication and leadership skills through a variety of hands-on experiences...and having fun! The opportunity for our young people to share these experiences with deputies of the Sarasota County Sheriff's Office is a feature that truly distinguishes SAL from other youth programs.

## Saddles

**Description** Saddles is a collaborative effort between the Sheriff's Activities League

and the Sarasota County Sheriff's Office Mounted Patrol, which culminates with a riding experience at Rosaire's Riding Academy in Sarasota, or the Bit of Hope Ranch in Englewood. Topics covered include: the role of horses in law enforcement, general grooming and hygiene, animal nomenclature, team-building, community service, and law

enforcement ethics.

Saddles offers an opportunity for the students to enter the world of a **Short Term Success** 

horse, and in many cases, for the very first time. In addition to the law enforcement-related lessons, the kids learn about the horse itself, the living environment, and the necessary grooming, maintenance, and nurturing that are required to properly care for the animals. The riding experience is often an opportunity for the kids to overcome a very real fear

of horses.

All of these lessons are facilitated by deputies from the Sarasota County Sheriff's Office. That positive interaction reinforces the idea that cops are

to be respected, not feared, and that cops can be trusted.

Working through that fear, and overcoming that obstacle, is a **Long Term Success** 

genuine "lightbulb" moment, which could very well provide a kid with a useful tool on which to rely when later faced with other obstacles in life.

The positive interaction with law enforcement officers cannot be overstated. The positive interactions with these deputies are an integral part of shaping the students' future notions of law enforcement. When

those beliefs are then shared with peers, and others in the community, the

benefits could be immeasurable.

SAL will begin implementing pre and post program surveys. Items on **Program Success Monitoring** 

> those surveys will include information that is specific to the program itself (how much did the student learn about horses, etc.), as well as the

students' thoughts and feelings toward law enforcement.

These are a few testimonial statements from students at Booker Middle **Program Success Examples** School:

"The reason I like being in the SAL program is because I get to be myself

around them. They are like brothers to me."

"There are many reasons I like the SAL program. I like the SAL program." because it teaches me life lessons and life skills. It also allows me to stay out of trouble. We also do a lot of fun things that we might not ever be able to do again. We also are taught about real life and how it is going to

be. That is why I like the SAL program."

Good Eats

Over the years, food has become an integral part of our SAL Description

activities. After experimenting with different types of afterschool

snacks/food items, it became apparent that many of the kids needed a full

meal rather than just a snack. Taking the kids to a local eating

establishment became the norm. I discovered that many of the kids had never been to some of the more common restaurants, and places that most people take for granted. Giving them the opportunity to choose

"whatever they wanted" was a treat for them, and to the

deputies. Providing that opportunity became an exciting learning experience for making better (and more diverse!) food choices. Breaking bread together also afforded an opportunity for relationships to flourish within the respective SAL groups. And thus, Good Eats was born.
