The 'man page' equivalent for the jamf binary is the 'help' verb

To see the help page for all the standard verbs in the jamf binary: **jamf help**

To see the help page for all the verbs rewritten into Objective-C (hidden and standard): **sudo jamf help -new**

To see only the legacy verbs that have not been rewritten (hidden and standard): **sudo jamf help -legacy**

To see the help page for ALL the verbs (hidden and standard): **sudo jamf help -all**

To see the help page for a specific verb (using recon as the example): **jamf help recon**

To see the help page for a specific verb including any hidden options: **sudo jamf help recon -all**

Commonly used jamf binary verbs:

sudo jamf policy

*checks-in (does not update inventory)

sudo jamf policy -event <custom event name>

*example: sudo jamf policy -event TestPolicy1

sudo jamf policy -id <id of the policy>

*example: sudo jamf policy -id 12

sudo jamf recon

*updates inventory (does not check-in)

sudo jamf removeMDMProfile

*removes the MDM Profile; however, note applicable if removal is disallowed in a DEP PreStage

sudo jamf removeFramework
*removes the Jamf binary and all other Jamf Components off the computer

sudo jamf manage *enforces entire management framework to install/update on the computer

sudo jamf mdm *prepares the computer for MDM and will install an MDM Profile if one is not present
